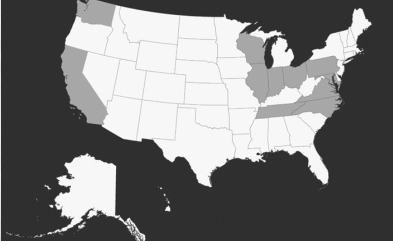


PERSPECTIVES ON PATHWAYS TO EMPLOYMENT

Researchers at the VCU-RRTC sent out a national Delphi survey to see if people agreed about how helpful different methods are for getting people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) an integrated job in the community that pays at least minimum wage.

What We Asked About:

The survey asked about five different methods known to help people with IDD get a job they like in their community. These methods are called supported employment (SE), customized employment (CE), college programs, internships and apprenticeships.
